Fund Spotlight -**ELLEN SEBERG MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

Just one of the nearly 150 funds held by the Hastings Community Foundation

The Ellen Seberg Memorial Scholarship, established in 1999, benefits those in the nursing program at the School of Nursing at Bryan College of Health Sciences at Mary Lanning. Herbert Seberg first established the fund to honor his late wife, Ellen (Diemer) Seberg.

Ellen was dedicated to the nursing profession. While serving as a nurse in the Army, Ellen's tour of duty took her around the world, including being stationed in India. The traveling didn't keep her from receiving letters and writing to a young Herb, a former classmate who was also serving in the Army.

Ellen and Herb were married in 1947 and soon established a family and business (what would become Central Dental Group) in Hastings.

Ellen passed in 1989. Herb partnered with the HCF to establish the Ellen Seberg Memorial Scholarship to honor her legacy. As the nursing program in Hastings has evolved, the scholarship has too ensuring an annual scholarship continues to be awarded to those studying to be part of the profession that Ellen Seberg loved.

Laundry Love

The kids need clean clothes for school You need a clean outfit for a job interview. You don't own a washing machine and can't afford to hit the laundromat. It's a



dilemma faced by families, including those in our community.

When St. Mark's Episcopal Pro-Cathedral's congregation became aware of the need for laundry services, they found a solution in partnering with Laundry Love. This national program offers free-use of washers, dryers, detergent, and dryer sheets to individuals and families who are hard-pressed to cover the cost of basic necessities.

Hastings is the only location in Nebraska to offer Laundry Love's services. A recent Community Grant from the Hastings Community Foundation will be used to pay for months' worth of washers, dryers, and supplies for anyone in the community who needs them.

"Having clean laundry is a basic need that most people take for granted," said Rev. Katie Hargis, Dean and Rector of St. Mark's Church. "This is a safe place where anyone can come and do their laundry in a safe, judgement free zone."

Laundry Love is offered monthly on the second Saturday from 2-5 pm and the fourth Tuesday from 5-8 pm at Burlington Village Laundromat in Hastings.

The average Laundry Love event in 2023 assisted 66 individuals representing 26 households at an average cost of \$743.40 per event.

HCF Announces Campaign for New Location

The Hastings Community Foundation is excited to announce a fundraising campaign for a new home. A purchase agreement for space in the Stein Building in the heart of downtown Hastings (620 W. 2nd Street) has been signed and is contingent on successful fundraising.

"This is an incredibly exciting next chapter for the Hastings Community Foundation," said Dan Peters, executive director for the HCF. "Our staff and board have been discussing a move for a number of years. We were not looking for a quick move. We were looking for the right move and one that could support our continued growth and leadership. That's exactly what we have in this space."

With the purchase of the space in the Stein Building, the HCF will have visibility that matches our impact. This move will nearly double the office space compared to the current location. In addition, the HCF will co-own 1,170 of shared space, including meeting rooms and restrooms.

The HCF is working with the Schnase 1906 District, a separate nonprofit who will also office in the Stein Building, for a joint campaign. Together, the project is \$2.5 million, including purchase and build out of the space for both organizations. To date, more than \$1.5 million has been secured via cash and pledges. The goal is to secure the remaining dollars by summer. This would allow for build out to start this year with occupancy in the first half of 2025.

Gifts of any level are now being accepted. Additionally, all gifts will be recognized via a donor board. Naming opportunities and pledges of up to three years are also available. Visit hastingscommunityfoundation.org to learn more, view additional images and to make a gift.

Eight Organizations New to Give Day

Give Hastings Day is Thursday, May 2 (early giving is now open). Of the 108 nonprofit organizations and projects participating - eight are taking part for the first time. While new to Give Day, many have long been established in our community. Here is who is new this year.

The Arc of Adams - Clay - An advocacy organization since 1967 that promotes and protects the human rights of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and actively supports their full inclusion and participation in the community.

Bigfoot Information Group - The purpose of the Bigfoot Information Group (BIG) is to provide financial support for gathering accurate and truthful information about large bipedal animals, and conveying that information to the public.

Hastings Food Pantry - Since 1982, the Hastings Food Pantry has served Hastings and the surrounding areas with food for individuals and families when requested to do so by an individual, local service agencies, or churches.

Healthy Families Nebraska Heartland - One of the leading family support and evidence-based home visitation programs in the US. They believe early, nurturing relationships are the foundation for healthy development. Formerly

known as Healthy Beginnings at Mary Lanning Healthcare, it is now operated by the South Heartland District Health Department.

Hike & Bike Trails Fund - This fund is used to provide trail amenities such as benches, bike repair stations and drinking fountains to be placed along the more than 12 miles of the Pioneer Spirit Trail. The trail will be extended through the south part of Hastings during the 2024 construction season.

Honor & Remember Memorial Forest - As part of the national Honor and Remember project, this chapter will pay tribute to approximately 150 Adams County fallen military and first responder heroes with a memorial forest at Parkview Cemetery.

Nebraska Antique Airplane Preservation Inc. - Has various aircraft housed at Hastings municipal airport hanger and displays these aircraft at events, including at their monthly hamburger feed.

The Zone After School Program - Provides a safe, fun, drug and alcohol-free environment for middle schoolers. Includes free dinner program, homework tutoring, arts and crafts, sports games, classes and lessons, academic enrichment opportunities, and community service learning projects.


