### Responding to an Urgent Need

Grants In Action

Meeting after meeting, the problem was the same. Area nonprofits who offer emergency assistance to individuals were all running out of funds



to help pay for fuel. Being able to fill up the car allows individuals to get to work, medical appointments, job interviews, and get kids to school. Without gas in the tank, income is lost and school is missed.

The Hastings Community Foundation heard about the need and knew we could be of assistance. We also knew that community partnerships could further expand the solutions available for this important issue.

The HCF contacted the United Way of South Central Nebraska with an offer. If we awarded a grant of \$1,500 for fuel cards, would they match it? The answer was an enthusiastic YES. In addition, local retailers where the gas cards were purchased were willing to add a 10% bonus onto the amount purchased.

HCF's initial \$1,500 grant has now transformed into \$3,300 for emergency fuel cards to be distributed through the Community Impact Network.

"This is a great example of the partnerships that exist in our community," explains Dan Peters, executive director of the Hastings Community Foundation. "We are always seeking ways to get the most impact from our efforts. Partnering with our United Way allowed us to multiply the resources available for addressing a real community need."

# **HCF Services for Year-End Giving**

The end of the calendar year means a busy season for charitable giving. The Hastings Community Foundation has tools and services to help reach your year-end philanthropic goals.

**Donor Advised Fund** – Think of DAFs as a philanthropic investment account. A DAF is established with an initial contribution of cash or securities, the full amount of which may be eligible for an immediate charitable tax benefit. The fund grows with investment earnings (and any additional contributions you make). Distributions from the fund to nonprofits are made in amounts and on timelines that you suggest.

**Anonymous Giving** – Some donors wish to make gifts anonymously to nonprofit organizations, but still want to receive a charitable tax receipt. The HCF is happy to facilitate these transactions. Donors can write a single check (payable to Hastings Community Foundation) and provide us instructions on how the gift is to be distributed. We'll receipt your gift and make your distributions anonymously. Any special correspondence we receive as a result of your anonymous gifts will be forwarded onto you.

**Transfer of Securities** - You can turn securities (including stocks or distributions from an IRA) into a cash gift for your favorite nonprofit. The process starts when you transfer securities to the HCF. Those securities are liquidated, and proceeds are allocated to nonprofit organizations based on your recommendations. (This process can be especially convenient if you're wanting to complete multiple Qualified Charitable Distributions with one simple transfer.) Including the Hastings Community Foundation as a recipient of the proceeds is always appreciated, but not required.

# **Key Society Provides Communications Board**

Sometimes the best resources are the simplest ones. When local speech pathologists needed funding for a communications board at the Crosier Park playground, the Hastings Community Foundation's Key Society was able to provide the \$3,000.

The 70-inch by 19-inch communications board is a low-tech method of communication for children who are minimally or non-speaking. Board vocabulary was customized by RiteCare Clinic Hastings MMI Speech-Language pathologists with appropriate symbols and vocabulary to meet children's communication needs on a playground.

Speech pathologist Sydney Norton explains, "Children with speech-language disorders can come and tell their family 'I'm hurt, I have to go potty, I made a new friend,' and they can really dive into those social, emotional communication opportunities that a park gives a child."



The playground provides a sensory-rich environment that enables children of all abilities to engage physically and socially in a supportive environment. The playground is ideal for children ages 0-12.

"I drew out the letters on graph paper and scaled them up on the wall," explained Schwinn. "Each square on my graph paper represented six inches. The letters with straight edges weren't too bad, but the curved letters took a couple of attempts and extra points of reference. I essentially made myself a giant dot-to-dot drawing for the two Ss and the G. Once the math part was done, I was in my comfort zone, which was painting the scenes.<sup>1</sup>
