

HCF Continues to Make Record Impact

Community Foundation Offers Give Day Endowment Prize

Give Hastings Day returns on May 4 with 108 (a new record!) local nonprofit organizations and projects participating. The event, now in its tenth year, has become the biggest philanthropic day in Adams County.

To celebrate the 10 year milestone, the Hastings Community Foundation will be awarding a \$10,000 endowment prize to one organization who meets eligibility requirements.

As an endowed fund, it will be invested with a portion of the balance distributed annually to the benefiting organization. The principal balance is never spent allowing the fund to grow. This powerful gift is truly one that keeps on giving.

While Give Hastings Day culminates on May 4, early giving is now

open. The early giving period allows donors to send their gift via mail or to drop off their gift prior to May 4. Regardless of the method or the date of the gift, all gifts received on or before May 4 allow the participating nonprofits to access bonus dollars and other incentives provided by Give Day sponsors.

The Lark, in downtown Hastings, will again serve as Give Day Headquarters.

Give Day HQ is open to the public all day. A full schedule of events includes meals, a business after hours, live music, a community art project, and a venue to cheer on our progress with Give Day organizers.

New Organizations to Give Day 2023

Give Hastings Day features 12 first time participants, including:

F4 Phantom Jet Restoration - project goal includes a restoration of the original lighting and exterior aesthetics, and repainting and wrapping the jet.

Guardian Angel Life Services - helps the individuals served achieve independence by offering protective services and support.

Hastings Community Music Academy - strives to create a community where everyone has access to connect through collaborative musical experiences, and to give all people the opportunity to learn and grow with others.

Housing Development Corporation - helps to provide safe, affordable housing to low/moderate income individuals and families.

Idlewilde Playground (SID #2) - provides a community gathering space with an inclusive playground in the heart of Adams County Subdivision - Idlewilde Acres.

Juniata Splash Pad Project - the Juniata Community Improvement Project is currently raising funds for a free community splash pad.

Kenesaw Senior Citizens, Inc. - organized and intended to be a nonprofit for charitable, scientific or educational purposes for our members.

NCHS (Nebraska Children's Home Society) - provides safe and loving care to children of all ages.

Proteus - provides agricultural workers and their families with affordable health care, education assistance, and job training.

Quilts of Valor - covers US military service members and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing quilts of valor.

Royal Family Kids - provides a week long camp for local foster children (6-11) who have been abused or neglected.

Schnase 1906 District - will serve as a hub for innovation and a one-stop full-service location for aspiring and existing entrepreneurs and small businesses.

1. Allow time if mailing.

You can make your gift at givehastings.org anytime between now and May 4. Some people prefer to make a gift via check or cash. If you do prefer to mail your gift, remember that delivery times can sometimes be a bit unpredictable. We advise

You may also choose to drop-off your gift to the Hastings Community Foundation office located on the second floor of Heritage Bank at 800 W. 3rd Street. (On May 4, you can bring your gift directly to our Give Day Headquarters at The Lark in downtown Hastings.)

2. Utilize QCD. Give Hastings Day has become a convenient vehicle for those looking to make a QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution). A single QCD can be made to the Hastings Community Foundation and then allocated to Give Day participants based on your instructions. Contact your financial advisor or the Hastings Community Foundation to discuss more about this easy option.

3. Your gift unlocks bonus money. Thanks to the generous support of our sponsors, all the Give Day organizations receive Bonus Bucks based on how much they raise. In addition, there are incentives based around the number of donors each organization receives. By just making a gift to your favorite nonprofits, no matter the amount, you're helping them to earn even more prize money!

4. Study your options. With 108 different organizations participating in Give Day, there are sure to be some that are new to you. Each of the organizations have descriptions listed at givehastings.org. Take time to read about all the nonprofits and consider donating to one (or two!) that are new to you.

5. Don't keep Give Day a secret. Talk to your friends about how easy and rewarding of an experience Give Day was for you. We appreciate your help in spreading the word and further growing Give Hastings Day!

How You Can Support the Hastings Community Foundation on Give Day

We appreciate the support we get from friends like you on Give Hastings Day! Your gifts are essential to our continued operations and allow us to provide resources and leadership to the community. Historically, there was a single Give Day designation for all Hastings Community Foundation gifts - regardless if it was support for our mission, a Key Society membership, or an unrestricted gift. To make it easier to properly recognize and process your gift, this year Give Day will feature two separate ways you can donate to us - "Hastings Community Foundation - Key Society" and "Hastings Community Foundation."

The Key Society is our program that identifies opportunities to create or enhance projects that better the



quality of life in our community. Key Society projects have included the Splash Pad at Libs Park and a significant gift to enhance the playground at Crosier Park. Key Society membership is only \$250 annually per household. (Those under 40 can join Key Society for \$100 the first year and \$175 the second year.)

New this year, those who want to support the HCF with a non-Key Society donation, can do so with gifts to the "Hastings Community Foundation."
